### **WITHINTHE PARISH**

Because of the Communion Breakfast, there will be NO Church School today; all classes will resume next Sunday, March 29.

**TODAY** is **Lenten Youth Sunday**, where our young people, under the caring eyes of helpful adults, took over many responsibilities of the Divine Liturgy. How very wonderful it was for our boys and girls to show the rest of the parish what the Lord is doing in their lives; we are truly blessed to have them as part of our church family.

Farther David will be concluding his **Faith Enrichment Series** on the basics of the Christian Faith **this Friday, March 27**, following Matins and the Akathist to the Theotokos. Anyone interested is invited to remain in the church, where Father will offer a reflection on the Creed and its application in our lives. Please give serious thought and prayer to taking advantage of this great "refresher" course.

There will be a Senior R Club Meeting at the Deerson home next Sunday, March 29, immediately after Coffee Hour.

Our parish will serve as host for Deanery Lenten Mission Vespers next Sunday, March 29, at 4 p.m. This beautiful service will be led by our area clergy. A Lenten meal in the church hall will follow. We pray that you will join us as we come together in faith, worship and fellowship.

As Orthodox, we believe that the **Sacrament of Holy Unction** is an opportunity for us to encounter the Lord and experience His grace at a time when we may be suffering, either physically, mentally or spiritually. When we are anointed, it is in the name of Christ and the Church. On **Thursday, April 2**, at 7 p.m., we will celebrate this sacrament. We invite anyone whose health is seriously impaired, in any way, to come and receive healing, asking God to be transformed by it and to bring its reality into your actions and faith. (<u>NOTE</u>: In order to properly approach the Mystery of Holy Unction and benefit most from it, you should be absolved from your sins beforehand through Confession, especially if you are not a regular communicant. Any questions? Ask Fr. David.)

The Installation of the 2015 Parish Council will take place on Saint Thomas Sunday, April 19, with a brief prayer service following Liturgy. The first meeting of the new Council will be held in the church hall on Monday, April 20, at 7 p.m.

MEMORY ETERNAL It's with regret that we announce the falling asleep of Protopresbyter Thomas Hopko, former Dean and Professor of Saint Vladimir Seminary in Yonkers, NY, on Wednesday, March 18, the Feast of the Repose of Saint Nikolai of Zhicha. It is impossible to speak of Fr. Tom other than in superlatives: loving, compassionate, articulate, prolific, caring, faithful, devout—he was a priest and a teacher in the very best senses of those meaningful terms. Those who knew him loved him; the better they knew him, the more they loved him. His influence and impact on the lives of seminarians, future priests, including our own Father David, as well as laymen, were nothing short of gigantic. His passing leaves a void in the Orthodox Church in America (OCA) that will be difficult to fill. Let us pray for this servant of God, whose spirituality was so profound and whose closeness to the Lord was so evident, that he now enjoys the eternal life with Him that he so richly deserves—Vechnaya Pamyat!
