FOOD CARD PROGRAM Thank you to all those parishioners who helped raise a profit of \$1,002 for the first three months of this year; our goal for 2015 is \$4,000. If you are not already a participant in this church fundraiser, consider purchasing food cards to any of these local supermarkets—ShopRite, Pathmark, Acme and Stop & Shop—before you do your grocery shopping. Each time you buy a food card, you are making a 5% donation to the parish at NO EXTRA COST to you. Out of 88 families pictured in the new Church Directory, only 38 buy food cards on a regular basis. If the remaining 50 bought just one \$25 card per month, it would bring in an extra \$750 a year. We are called to recite or sing the Paschal Troparion ("Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death and, upon those in the tombs, bestowing life!") before every meal until the Feast of the Ascension which, this year, falls on May 21. This hymn should also be included in our morning and evening prayers. Our homes and hearts should be filled with these words and truth continuously; we must let them overflow from our being into all with whom we deal daily.

Also, there is NO KNEELING in prayer during the fifty days following Pascha, as we should not be focused on our failings and sinfulness but, rather, on the love of the Lord and the glory of His Resurrection.



The **Midfeast of Pentecost** is the midpoint of the 50 days between Holy Pascha and Pentecost. On this day, we commemorate the event from the life of the Savior when He taught in the temple about His own divine ministry and the mystery of water, which He attributed as a sign of grace of the Holy Spirit that comes into the world to heal all of its infirmities, both physical and spiritual, and to grant a life of salvation to the thirsty. Accordingly, the **Lesser Blessing of Water** will take place following Liturgy **this Wednesday**. Please make every effort to attend and don't forget to bring a container with you to take some water home.



:HEALING OF THE PARALYTIC:



Close to the Sheep's Gate in Jerusalem, there was a pool, which was ealled Bethesda. It had five porches, that is, five sets of pillars supporting a domed roof. Under this roof, laid very many sick people with various maladies, waiting for the moving of the water. The first to step in after the troubling of the water was healed immediately of whatever sickness he had.

It was there that the paralytic in today's Gospel was lying, tormented by his infirmity of 38 years. When Christ beheld him, He asked him, "Do you want to be healed?" And he answered with a quiet and meek voice, "Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool." The Lord said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." And immediately the man was made whole and took up his bed. Walking in the presence of all, he departed rejoicing to his own house. According to Fathers of the Church, the Lord healed this paralytic during the days of Passover, when He had gone to Jerusalem for the feast, and lived there teaching and working miracles. According to St. John the Evangelist, this miracle took place on the Sabbath.
