#### ASK AND YOU SHALL RECEIVE

Prayer is not just a way of getting what we want, but also a way of becoming what God wants us to be. We see this in the lives of Saints Joachim and Anna, the parents of the Mother of God and the grandparents of Jesus Christ.

SS. Joachim and Anna were married in Nazareth where they lived in faithfulness and devotion to God and each other. They were known to give generously to the temple and to the poor; yet, they were sad because they were not blessed with children.

Tradition tells us that on one occasion, after they were both already very old, Joachim and Anna were in Jerusalem to offer sacrifice in the temple. Joachim was not permitted to do so because he had no children. Both he and his wife were rebuked and scorned and their childlessness became a source of sadness and shame for them. Yet, they prayed earnestly to God for a solution and He answered their prayer in a most unexpected and delightful way! Even in her advanced age, Anna conceived and gave birth to a girl who became the Mother of God!

God answered their prayers and, at the same time, incorporated them into His plan for the salvation of mankind. Let us remember that He knows what we want—and what we need—even before we ask or are aware of it. And, the answer to our prayer may not only be for our benefit, but for the benefit of others, as well.
